

Good-quality, slavery-free tea and coffee are now more accessible than ever, with both local shops and major supermarkets offering a wide range of ethical options. When choosing your brew, look for the FAIRTRADE or Rainforest Alliance logos to ensure your purchase supports fair wages

and safe working conditions.
